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The Science Department

The Science Learning Area includes departments for KS3 Science, Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Working as part of a high performing team of science teachers with brilliant pupils makes Mossbourne an extremely rewarding place to teach. The Learning Area is also the home of the sixth form 'Medical Bursary Programme' a unique programme which supports pupils explore careers in medicine and veterinary science and equips them with the skills and experiences largely on offer in the independent sector. We have had incredible success with this programme which has supported significant numbers of alumni embark upon a career in medicine.

We focus on high quality professional development to support exceptional outcomes for our pupils and place learning at the heart of all we do for pupils and staff, alike.
